A regular meeting of the Fortune Town Council was held on Monday, March 6, 1989, at 2 pm at Lake Academy. Members present were Mayer King, Deputy Mayor Piercey, Penwell, Cooper & King. Mr. Giles welcomed Council & thanked them for coming to the school on behalf of the Education Week Committee.

## Items Arising from Minutes:

- (1) Confirmation received from K. & M. Vending Ltd., re: purchase of land. The measurement to be checked by New Plan.
- (2) Customs Building - Letters sent to Hon Elmer Mackay, January 30, February 24, March 1, 1989, but no reply received. The Town Manager informed Council that it was possible CN Marine would be relocating to Fortune. He had contacted Mr. Don Lester of Canadian Coast Guard, he will contact CN Marine & will inform Council. It was agreed to contact M.P. Roger Simmons to see if he has any information.
- (3) Travel Accident Policy - Council has reviewed the policy and can see no point in increasing same.
- (4) No reply from Elvis Wade Show.
- (5) Town Manager has spoken to Mrs. Thornhill, President Recreation Commission, plans for Fortune Day not yet finalized.
- (6) Town Manager reported that he had notified the Credit Union of rate to rent Town Hall - no reply.
- (7) Council was informed that the cost estimates & plot plan for phase I of a Residential Sub-division has been completed. Town Manager to contact the Minister of Housing to find out what programs are available.
- (8) Business permit has been issued to Valerie Monster for Beauty Salon.

## Items Town Manager's File:

- (1) Letter - Arena Managers Association - follow up request for financial support of the Eber Bloomfield Memorial Scholarship. The Town Manager suggested that since Council did not agree with the method of disbursing the scholarship and the financial position of the Town at this time, we should write and explain why we will not be participating.



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- (2) Marine Service Center - Department of Fisheries and Oceans has authorized the consulting engineers - New Plan Ltd. to proceed with the acquisition of hand.
- (3) Councillors were reminded of the graduation for Grand Bank - Fortune Job Readiness Training Program to be held at the Town Hall on Tuesday, March 7, 1989, at 10:00 am.
- (4) Further correspondence from Newfoundland Federation of Municipalities re: Group Pension Plan. It was agreed to stay with Sun Life.
- (5) Town Manager had written to Dept. of Tourism and the Humber Valley Broadcasting Co. re: the short write up on Fortune in the NFLD Vacation Guide. He had received a call from Dr. Noël Murphy requesting that we send some pictures and he will try to increase the coverage.
- (6) Meeting of the Burin Peninsula Tourist Association was scheduled for Tuesday, February 28, 1989, but we had not been notified. Sadie Parsons called and advised of a committee being formed to do up a Advertising Brochure for the Burin Peninsula. Council to appoint a member to the Committee.
- (7) Town Manager reported on the meeting held in Marystown on March 1, 1989. Councillor Piercey, Cooper, and Town Manager attended. The meeting was called to form a coalition group to put together a Submission on the fishery. Council was requested to appoint a member to the committee. It was agreed Mayor King would represent Council on that committee.
