Residents of Logwood Road have been written regarding taking up pavement and filling with crushed stone.

Section 25 applied for.

Suggested we put an announcement on N-1 Cable regarding people putting the new numbers on their dwellings.

It was moved by Councillor Thornhill and seconded by Deputy Mayor Piercey the minutes be adopted as read. Motion carried.

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Piercey and seconded by Councillor Parsons the agenda be approved as read. Motion carried.

General:

It was agreed we would write Picco & White regarding our concerns for some of the issues they have to pursue for us.
